




PILGRIMAGE TO THE HOLY LAND & JORDAN

ITINERARY

Day 1 - Monday, June 11: Depart U.S.A.

Our pilgrimage begins today as we depart on our flight to Israel. Meals and drinks served aloft.

Day 2 - Tuesday, June 12: Arrive Tel Aviv / Jerusalem

After arrival at Ben Gurion Airport in Tel Aviv, we will be met by our local guide who will arrange the schedules of our visits and make the scripture come alive as we follow in the footsteps of Jesus. Drive to our hotel in Jerusalem for check-in.

Day 3 - Wednesday, June 13: Jerusalem

This morning, drive to the top of the Mt. of Olives for a spectacular view of Jerusalem. Visit the Church of Pater Noster and then walk along the "Palm Sunday Road" to Dominus Flevit, where Our Lord wept over Jerusalem. Proceed to the Garden of Gethsemane to visit the Church of All Nations and celebrate Mass in the Gethsemane Grotto. In the afternoon proceed to the Israel Museum to see the Shrine of the Book which houses the Dead Sea Scrolls and a scale model which depicts Jerusalem as it appeared during the time of Jesus. We will then have an opportunity for an optional visit to the Archaeological Sifting Project where those who are interested in joining will have an opportunity to help sift through debris that had been removed from the Temple Mount in search of archaeological finds.

Day 4 - Thursday, June 14: Jerusalem

This morning we will visit the Western Wall Tunnel which explores the underground portions of the Western Wall of the Temple Mount. Then drive to Bethlehem to celebrate Mass at the Nativity

Church which was built by Constantine in the 4th Century above the traditional Grotto of Jesus' birth. Then tour the Grotto of St. Jerome, the Church of St. Catherine and the Shepherd's Fields before returning to Jerusalem. This evening enjoy a cocktail reception atop the Notre Dame Center with a beautiful view overlooking the Old City.

Day 5 - Friday, June 15: Jerusalem

This morning we will drive through the Judean Wilderness and along the Dead Sea (the lowest spot on earth) to Masada. An exciting ascent by cable car will take us to this last stronghold of the Jewish Zealots in their war against the Romans in 73 A.D. Then proceed to Qumran to see the caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered. Continue onto ancient Jericho to visit the ruins of the ancient city which was conquered by Joshua. From the top of the ancient "tel" we'll have an excellent view of Elisha's Fountain and the Mt. of Temptation. Motor over the winding mountain roads and via Good Samaritan Inn back to Jerusalem.

Day 6 - Saturday, June 16: Jerusalem

After an early morning Mass at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre we will return to our hotel for breakfast. Then later in the morning we will visit the Temple Area of the Old City featuring the Dome of the Rock, Mosque el Aqsa, and the Wailing Wall. Then enter the Old City of Jerusalem to visit the Church of St. Anne, the Pool of Bethesda, the Chapel of Flagellation, Lithostrotos, and the Arch of the "Ecce Homo". Follow the Via Dolorosa to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre to visit Golgotha and the Tomb of Our Lord. While at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre we will also have an opportunity to visit St. Vartan's Chapel (subject to permission). Continue to Mt. Zion to visit the Upper Room which is the site of the Last Supper, St. Peter in Gallicantu where Peter denied Jesus three times and the House of Caiphas and the famous steps where most archeologists agree that Jesus walked on the night of His arrest.

Day 7 - Sunday, June 17: Jerusalem / Petra

Drive to the Allenby Bridge and cross into the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan. Visit the traditional Baptismal Site on the Jordan River which was visited by the Pope during his pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Travel south to Mount Nebo where Moses viewed the promised land. After celebrating Mass at Mount Nebo we will visit a mosaic store where we will see how mosaics are made. The highlight of our day will be the descent into Petra, one of the most magnificent sites in the Middle East.

Day 8 - Monday, June 18: Petra / Dead Sea

This morning will be spent in Petra, one of the most magnificent sites in the Middle East. This "Rose Red City" is literally carved into the sides of a deep gorge. Petra's most famous monument, the Treasury, appears dramatically at the end of the canyon. Used in the film "Indiana Jones and the Last Crusade," the towering facade of the Treasury is only one of myriad archaeological wonders to be explored at Petra. We will have an option to walk, ride a horse (no riding experience required) or take a horse-drawn carriage into this ancient site and after passing through the narrow 100 foot cliffs we will see a remarkable sight: temples, tombs, and dwellings chiseled right into the limestone walls. After touring Petra we will drive north to the Crusader Fortress of Shobak. Then continue to the Dead Sea for check-in at our local hotel.

Day 9 - Tuesday, June 19: Dead Sea / Amman / Galilee

This morning will be at free to enjoy the hotel's facilities and take a swim in the Dead Sea. Mid-morning we will depart for Amman, the capital of Jordan. Amman is a city of wide streets, modern shops and spacious villas dotting the hills - all signs of growth; yet the entire area reflects a bygone civilization. A drive around the city takes us to the impressive Roman amphitheater which once accommodated 6,000 spectators and the hilltop Citadel. We will then visit the Amman Archaeological Museum before departing Amman and driving north to Jerash which was founded by the soldiers of Alexander the Great in 300 B.C. Jerash now stands as the best preserved ruins of a provincial Greco-Roman city in the world. Along a 2-mile stretch we'll see the oval shaped forum encircled by 56 graceful Roman columns, Hadrian's Arch, the Temples of Artemis and Zeus, and the massive Roman theater. Continue to the Sheikh Hussein Bridge and cross into Israel. Transfer to our hotel in Galilee.

Day 10 - Wednesday, June 20: Galilee

This morning we will visit the Mt. of the Beatitudes for Mass at the site of the Sermon on the Mount. Here we will also visit the small cave which archaeologists believe Jesus used as a retreat. Then enjoy a scenic boat ride on the Sea of Galilee to Kibbutz Ginossar where we will see a perfectly intact 2,000 year old wooden boat recently

discovered on its shores. Continue to Capernaum, home of Our Lord during his ministry. After visiting the Synagogue where he taught we proceed to Tabgha - the site of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes. The Church of St. Peter's Primacy will be our next stop. Then drive to Cana of Galilee, where Our Lord performed the first miracle - changing water into wine at the wedding feast.

Day 11 - Thursday, June 21: Galilee

Following breakfast, we will visit the recent and exciting discovery of the Magdala Synagogue where we will celebrate Mass. Then drive to Nazareth to visit the Annunciation Basilica and enjoy a complete visit of Our Lord's boyhood town including Mary's Well. We will then visit "Nazareth Village" for a firsthand experience of ancient life through its recreated historical homes, shops and farms. Proceed to Sepphoris where we will have an opportunity to explore the excavations of the ancient capital of Galilee where Jesus and Joseph would have worked every day.

Day 12 - Friday, June 22: Galilee / Jerusalem

This morning we will check out from our hotel and return to Jerusalem for a free afternoon to explore on our own. This evening we will enjoy a farewell Middle Eastern dinner.

Day 13 - Saturday, June 23: Jerusalem / Tel Aviv / U.S.A.

This morning we will transfer to the airport to catch our return flight home.

The sequence of sightseeing and schedule of events detailed in the preceding itinerary may be subject to change based upon availability at the time of arrival and at the discretion of our local guide and Fr. Dave.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND CONDITIONS

Reservations and Payment: Please complete the attached Reservation Application and return it with your deposit of \$300.00 per person at the time of booking. Final payment is due 65 days prior to departure.

Cancellations: All cancellations must be in writing. The following per person cancellation charges will apply: If canceled 91 days or more prior to departure, a \$50.00 administrative fee will be charged. If canceled 90 - 61 days prior to departure, \$250.00 will be charged. If canceled 60 - 31 days prior to departure, \$450.00 will be charged. If canceled 30 - 7 days prior to departure \$700.00 will be charged. No refunds will be made within 6 days of departure. In addition, once the airline tickets have been issued, 100% of the airfare is non-refundable unless you have been advised otherwise at the time of your booking. Additional cancellation charges may apply depending upon the cancellation terms of our suppliers.

Refunds: Subject to the foregoing Cancellation Terms, upon cancellation of travel related services, all sums paid to George's International Tours for such services will be promptly returned to the passenger, provided the passenger has not caused such cancellation and is not in violation of any of the terms and conditions previously, clearly and conspicuously disclosed and agreed to by the passenger. This refund provision does not apply where George's International Tours has remitted the payment to another registered seller of travel or a carrier and they default in providing the agreed-upon transportation or service without providing a refund. In such a situation, George's International Tours agrees to provide passenger with a written statement accompanied by a copy of the bank records establishing the disbursement of the payment, and if disbursed to a seller of travel, proof of their current registration.

Trust Account Disclosure: California law requires certain sellers of travel to have a trust account or bond. George's International Tours has such a trust account.

Travel Consumer Restitution Corporation ("TCRC"): George's International Tours is a participant in the Travel Consumer Restitution Corporation ("TCRC"). You, the passenger, may request reimbursement from TCRC if the Seller of Travel was registered and participating in the TCRC at the time of sale and the passenger is located in California at the time of payment. Please be advised that passengers purchasing from outside of California are not covered by the TCRC. Eligible passengers may file a claim with TCRC if the passenger is owed a refund of more than \$50 for transportation or travel services which the Seller of Travel failed to forward to a proper provider or if such money was not refunded to you when required. The maximum amount which may be paid by the TCRC to any one passenger is the total amount paid on behalf of the passenger to the Seller of Travel, not to exceed \$15,000. A claim must be submitted to the TCRC within six months after the scheduled completion date of the travel. A claim must include sufficient information and documentation to prove your claim and a \$35 processing fee. You must agree to waive your right to other civil remedies against a registered participating Seller of Travel for matters arising out of a sale for which you file a claim with the TCRC, if you were located in California at the time of the sale. Travel Documents: A passport with a minimum of 6 months validity remaining is required of all U.S. citizens. U.S. citizens do not require visas for entry to Israel but visas are required for entry to Jordan. The cost of the Jordanian visa is included in the cost of your trip and George's International will be procuring a group visa on your behalf. If you are not a U.S. citizen, please call to find out if you need a visa. George's International is not responsible for individual visas or passports.

Tour Cost: All quoted prices are based upon airfares, tariffs and currency exchange rates at the time of printing and are subject to change at any time. Should the minimum number of 20 tour members not be reached, the right is reserved to increase the tour cost accordingly.

Tour Documents and Tickets: Final tour documents are mailed, provided we have received full payment, within 3 weeks of departure.

Baggage: Each passenger is allowed one checked bag and one carry-on. You will be responsible for paying to the airline any additional charges for additional checked baggage or overweight baggage (if excess weight is permitted). George's International Tours is not responsible for lost, damaged or stolen baggage.

Air Transportation: Air travel is in economy class on Air Canada (or any other IATA carrier). Fares are based upon levels in effect at the time of printing. Fares and flight schedules are subject to change without notice.

Hotels: Accommodations are based on double occupancy rooms. A limited number of single rooms are available at the supplement quoted and should be requested at the time of booking.
